Dear Mr. Hurst:-

In reply to your letter of October 18th, I think that we shall have to leave Professor Kingsbury's appropriation until we can talk it over with her. The doctor will not allow her to return to work until November first. If you will remind me I will bring it up at the next meeting of the Board of Directors.

In regard to the Chemical Laboratory appropriation, I think that it had better stand as it is until we know exactly what was expended last year. This appropriation was made after consultation with Dr. Brunel, and later in the year we can increase it, if necessary.

The Psychology must stand as it is, and any further draft must be paid for by the professors in the Department. It is a great deal for this laboratory.

In regard to the Bureau of Appointments, Lectures and Entertainments we shall have to wait and see what they amount to. I will make a statement in the Board at the next meeting, and ask to have it put on the minutes to the effect that no appropriation whatever has been made for these. I do not wish them charged to my gift for the present.
