The cup to the troop that wins second honors will take the place of the one formerly given to the best individual bond salesman among the Scouts.

The Boy Scout headquarters for this campaign will be at Mr. Kopp's store.

Bonds and Bullets, Princeton's Liberty Loan newspaper, put out by the Committee in conjunction with the Packet, appeared as per schedule on Wednesday of this week, adorned with a special message to Princeton, from Governor Edge. Its report, up to the close of business October 7, brought the total of subscriptions up to \$219,350, and the list of subscribers to 876. The Honor Roll in this issue of the Packet begins where Bonds and Bullets left off, and gives names of those who bought, bonds on October 8, 9, and 10.
