

RALLIES TO BE HELD BY SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES

Annual Event of Bible Students a Feature in Many Churches Tomorrow.

PATRIOTISM IS KEYNOTE.

Sunday school rallies will be features in many churches of Pittsburgh tomorrow. The Sunday school class of the West End Methodist Episcopal Church will hold a rally at 9:45 o'clock in the auditorium of the church. Rev. Dr. Frank Knotts, vice chancellor of the American university, Washington, D. C., will deliver a sermon in the absence of the pastor, Rev. Frederick D. Esenwein, who is attending the conference at Tarentum.

Patriotic addresses will be made by John Weaver, former superintendent of the class, and others. An honor roll of nearly 60 names will be read. Following the sermon, women of the church will serve dinner in the social room, with Mrs. John Ashlin, chairman of the committee, in charge. Dr. A. E. Dietrich is superintendent and Charles A. Beakler, assistant superintendent of the class, which has a membership of nearly 300.

DRIVE FOR MEN ENDS.

The Brotherhood Note class will hold a rally in Emory Methodist Episcopal Church. The occasion will mark the close of a "Man-for-Man" drive for new members to replace those who have answered the call to the colors. The class honor roll contains the names of 13 members. Ross C. Zaringer and Norman W. Nolan were captains of two teams who canvassed the East Liberty district for new members.

Harry W. Dunlap, teacher of the class, will teach the lesson as usual, the subject for the day being, "Abraham Leaving Home."

At 2 o'clock the North Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church Sunday school will hold its annual rally. Rev. Robert P. Fairbroth, who returned recently from France, will be the speaker in the adult department. His subject will be "Over There." The class orchestra, under the direction of Charles N. Boyd, will furnish music.

Rallies also will be held by the Sunday school classes of Bethany Lutheran and Christ Lutheran churches. Both rallies will begin at 9:30 o'clock in the respective churches. The Glenshaw Presbyterian Church class will hold its rally at 10:30.

In the latter church next week evangelistic services will be conducted each evening preparatory to communion. Rev. Dr. Thomas R. Lewis of Pitts will preach Tuesday evening and pastors in the neighborhood on other evenings.

In the absence of Rev. Dr. George W. Whitton, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, who is campaigning in Minnesota for the National prohibition amendment, services in the Second Church tomorrow will be conducted by Rev. Dr. James M. Gray, Bible scholar of Moody Bible institute, Chicago. In the morning he will preach on "Why Germany Cannot Rule the World."

Patriotic singing will be a feature of the services in East End Christian Church. In the evening the pastor, Rev. Dr. John R. Dwers, will preach his fourth sermon in his series.

The Neighborhood Men's Bible class will resume the usual Bible study at 7:30 o'clock in its new location in the Fourth United Presbyterian Church, Northside. Rev. Dr. John McNaught, teacher, will lecture on "Israel, the Hero."

Russian evening will be observed in Calvary Episcopal Church. In Russia an Ally" being the sermon topic. N. Tchirkow, Russian consul, will be present. Addresses on Russia will be made by Revs. Nikolai, Roselovich and Poluka of the Russian Greek church, their congregations also attending. Rev. Lewis H. Whitmore, assistant minister, will preach. The Calvary Church choir of 70 voices under Harvey H. Gault, Alan Nern, Robert Graham and Emil Wolff, violinist, will take part in the musical program.

A member of the Pittsburgh conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, in position at Tarentum, will speak at the morning service in the Butler Street Methodist Episcopal Church. Rev. Dr. Frank Knotts will occupy the pulpit at 9:45 o'clock.

Rev. Stanley A. Hunter, pastor of the Church of the Presbyterian Church, will give an illustrated lecture at 8 o'clock on "A Summer With the Fathers."

Pictures of towns and cities captured by General Allenby in Palestine will be shown in the Bellevue Methodist Episcopal Church at the evening service.

Tomorrow will mark the Sept. 15th anniversary of the Manchester Presbyterian Church. Special lectures have been planned.
