

SCHOOLS STILL CLOSED; NO OPENING DATE SET

Although the private schools and business colleges of the city reopened yesterday with the raising of the quarantine ban, the public schools were not opened and Dr. Weaver, chief medical inspector, last night declared that they will not be reopened until conditions are safe.

"There have been returns today," said the doctor, "indicating illness among children in nine of the fourteen wards. The wards from which no cases were reported were the Third, Fourth, Seventh, Eleventh and Thirteenth. There is no indication now of any date on which it will be advisable to open the schools. We want to be absolutely sure before we do anything. And when the schools do open, all are not certain to be opened at once. We will first open those in districts that assure a greater measure of safety than the others."
