Death of Mrs. Sarah Rogers.

Mrs. Sarah Rogers died Saturday morning from infirmities at the home of H. C. Walker, where she has been kept since last spring. Mrs. Rogers came from Weston to this town over 20 years ago. Her husband preceded her in death a period of years.

Funeral services were held from the Walker home Monday afternoon, conducted by Rev. G. E. Congdon. Burial was in the Burgess yard.

Death of Sarah L. Sherwin.

Sarah Lamphear was one of six children of Henry and Experience (Moore) Lamphear, pioneers in the town of Windham. Of the family only one, a brother now remains. She was born in Windham, July 14, 1845. She was converted and joined the Windham Baptist church when about 20 years of age. She attended the district schools and later Leland and Gray seminary at Townshend and then taught several terms. She married, October 25, 1870, Parker Chapman, son of Amos Chapman. Since then her home has been either in the village of Grafton or the near vicinity. Of this marriage there was born one child, Jennie, now Mrs. Erwin E. Green, February 23, 1876. Mr. Chapman died February 3, 1877. On October 26, 1880, she married Sherman Sherwin, who died November 18, 1901. She died Wednesday, November 13, 1918. Funeral services were held from the home of her daughter Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Burial was in the village cemetery.
