The enclosed letter was a confidential communication from Admiral Jayne and the report of my inspection was made in like manner to him so please treat it as such. The result shows a greater difference in healthfulness in favor of the Training Camp at Mare Island than I had anticipated. The Admiral has not decided whether to make use of the information furnished or not. As there was no way of determining the morbidity of the Training Camp at San Francisco as the records were of the station as a whole, I think it would be well in case information should be desired at any time for comparisons between the different camps in the United States, that some indication be made on the records of recruits admitted to the sick list, as the initials of the training camp on the form "F" cards, the copy being the permanent record at the station. This method was found to be very helpful in examining records here at Mare Island.
