

QUARANTINE RULES MADE MORE STRICT

In addition to the quarantine regulations heretofore adopted the following are hereby put in force and will remain in force until farther orders. All persons entering the county of La Plata from the outside, are required to and must, produce a health certificate that they are in good health and not afflicted with any communicable disease. A permit from the local health officer will not be required. All persons entering the county of La Plata from the outside will be required to enter quarantine and remain quarantined forty-eight hours after their arrival. Quarantine headquarters will be established and such persons must immediately go to such quarantine headquarters and remain for 48 hours and longer, if disease manifests itself during that time. Residents of the county or city may go to their respective homes, instead of the quarantine station, but in such case the home of such person will be placed in strict quarantine for at least 48 hours. Persons coming into the county on trains on their way to places outside the county shall be quarantined during their stay in the county.

All places where cases of Spanish influenza are found to exist must be quarantined and the health officer will and must quarantine such places for such time as in his judgment the necessities of the case require, and during such quarantine no person shall, under any circumstances, enter or leave, the premises so quarantined without a written permit from the health officer. No milk shall be delivered in bottles to any place quarantined unless the said bottles permanently remain in such quarantined premises. Persons living in quarantined premises desiring to receive milk or groceries must furnish containers to be set outside of the house so that the milk or groceries may be placed by the milkmen or deliverymen in such containers, and such containers must not be permitted to be removed from the premises during the continuance of the quarantine.

All persons must promptly report all cases of Spanish influenza coming to their notice, whether called in to such case or not, in order that a perfect knowledge of the existence of the disease may be had.

All citizens are called upon to as-

sist the health officer in every way to stamp out this terrible disease. The board of health regrets that it finds these additional steps necessary and though in some cases they may entail hardships on some the board feels that it is necessary that such steps be taken and enforced and all good citizens are requested to lend their aid in this enforcement.
