Dear Miss Ehlers,

It has been reported to me that you gave permission to the two Junior Wardens in Lysyfran to spend the night in Denbigh during the <sup>several times</sup> time when the Health Department had said that no student might sleep in another Hall. As Dean Taft and I have considered removing the Junior Wardens for the disobedience of rules, I ~~sh~~ould be very glad if you would drop me a line saying whether or not you said anything which they possibly could have construed into permission to sleep in Denbigh. This would not excuse them, as the orders of the Health Department take precedence over every other kind of order, but it might mitigate their offence.
