Reimbursement for costs due to infl epidemic

November 12, 1918.

Dear Mr. Mantelii,

The Comptroller has sent me a statement of the financial loss caused by your not being able to travel on the New York trains. I should like to ask you about it before marking it correct. It was my understanding when we talked it over that from the amount you made in New York should be deducted the the expenses of your journey to and from New York including cabs, street car fares, etc. You also told me you could arrange your private classes in Philadelphia so as to give them at a different time so that the whole expense would be what you received from your lessons in New York minus your railroad, cab and car fare. You and I made a rough calculation at that time and you told me it would be between seventeen and nineteen dollars. I am enclosing the bill Miss Hobson forwarded to the Comptroller and should be very glad if you would return it to me corrected in accordance with my understanding.
