

HERE'S ALL THE FACTS ON THE INFLUENZA EPIDEMIC HERE

During the influenza epidemic in Montrose, according to the records at the city hall, there were 455 cases of contagion reported up to Thursday evening. Of this number 92 were from outside of the city, making 363 in the city proper and subtracting five for the three cases of smallpox and two of scarlet fever, it leaves 358 of influenza.

October 31, with 43 new cases, was the peak of the epidemic and here is the way it ran:
