# HIGH SCHOOL CLOSED AGAIN DUE TO FEAR OF INFLUENZA; WILL OPEN AGAIN ON DEC. 30

High school was closed this morning for the balance of the year, or practically that date as December 30 has been set for the opening date. Fear of a spread of influenza, which has Prof. J. P. Beatty, teacher of physics, the school is closed again. The influenza in school Wednesday and that Junior C. F. Heath has come down with the same disease, contributed to the closing order. No cases have been traced to the school attended, however, according to Dr. Isaiah Knott, city physician, who does not feel that the people have any great cause for alarm.

While the grade schools are not closed, these authorities believe that they will be as the parents will be keeping the children home thru year when they find out the high school being closed. There is no change in the program at the Central school and Johnson school. It seems to be a general opinion around town that the high school might as well be running as to have the young folks on Main street a good deal of the time or out in big places on the skating ponds but that is a matter for parents to look after until the authorities take action if they do.
