

INFLUENZA SHOWS GAIN IN CITY. IN LAST FEW DAYS, LOOKS BAD

REPORT

Fourteen new cases of influenza to report, 12 of them reported to the city hall and two of them not reported yet, but known to have it. The first twelve in the following list have been reported and the last two have the influenza, but have not yet been reported. Due to a request that the date of the beginning of the attack be published with the name so that the exact situation may be known by the readers of The Press, this paper will print after the name the date on which the sufferer came down with the disease.

- The situation here unquestionably looks a little worse than it has for several weeks and it is almost certain that more will die here before the epidemic dies out. The Press has reported 56 cases in the last four days, a heavy increase over the cases reported at the beginning of the epidemic.

INFLUENZA IS ON INCREASE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—A warning to the country that the Spanish influenza is by no means ended and that all possible regulations should be taken at once was issued last night by Surgeon General Blue of the public health service. Reports show a recrudescence of the disease from one end of the country to the other.

In the statement Surgeon Blue advises the closing of the public schools on the first sign of the reappearance of the epidemic, if it has abated in any community, or when any sign of an increase over the present status shows us. He says the disease apparently shows a decided tendency to occur more frequently among school children.

Will Get Mayo Vaccine to Fight "Flu" Epidemic
