

NIGHT SCHOOLS TO REOPEN JAN. 5

Beginning Delayed by Disease Epidemic, Term Will Last but 10 Weeks.

ALIENS ARE INVITED

An important Christmas gift was made yesterday to the foreign residents of the city, for whom the free evening schools are chiefly intended, by an announcement of the Board of Public Education that they will open Monday evening, January 5. The schools were prevented from opening in October by the influenza epidemic. The registration of students will take place on Friday, January 3.

"The government expects you to learn English. Come to the free evening schools" is the appeal which the board makes to the foreign-born residents. The schools will be open for instruction in elementary English and other subjects to all who apply. J. M. Berkey, director of evening schools and extension work, announced that the school buildings will be open for community meeting places.

More than 6,000 students attended evening high schools last year, of whom 65 finished full four-year high school courses, while 37,600 residents of the city were associated with the work. The schools cost the Board of Public Education \$65,000. Only half of the usual term of 80 weeks will now be given. The following school buildings will be used:

East End, Belmar School, Hermitage street and Lang avenue; Garfield School, North Atlantic avenue, near Penn avenue; Latimer School, Balmer avenue and Winslow street; McCleary School, McCandless avenue and Holmes street; Washington School, Fortieth street, below Butler street; Woolslaw School, Fortieth street and Liberty avenue.

Central, Forbes School, Forbes and Stevenson streets; Franklin School, Logan and Foxhurst streets; Hazelwood School, Second avenue and Tecumseh street; Holmes School, Lawson street, near Edith place; McKelvy School, Bedford avenue and Erin street; Ralston School, Penn avenue and Fifteenth street; Rose School, Rose and Charles streets; Watt School, Watt street and Webster avenue.

North Side, East Street School, 1612 East street; John Morrow School, Davis avenue and Fleming street; Latimer Junior High School, Tripoli and James streets; Manchester School, Chateau and Junata streets; Horace Mann School, Shadeland avenue and Dickson street; McNaugher School, Merritt, near Taggart street.

South Side, Humboldt School, South Twentieth and Sarah streets; South Hills High School, Ruth, Eureka and Garwood streets and Secane avenue; Thaddeus Stevens School, Main street.
