

Wearing of Masks to Be Made Compulsory

BURLINGAME, October 23.—The wearing of anti-influenza masks in San Mateo, Burlingame and Hillsborough will be made compulsory by trustees of the three towns, who tonight agreed to pass ordinances making it a misdemeanor for anyone to appear on the streets without a mask. They will make violation of the ordinance punishable by a fine of \$20 or twenty days imprisonment or both. The trustees agreed to appropriate \$1000 from the funds of each town to fight the influenza, and to ask the Supervisors for \$4000 more from the county. The John B. Caserly home in San Mateo was opened today as a temporary Red Cross hospital for civilians suffering from influenza. Mrs. Thomas H. Breeze is in charge.
