

Charge Policeman With Mask Graft

A charge that a policeman took a prisoner arrested for violating the mask ordinance from the City Prison to a saloon, where for \$5 he was allowed to go, was made in Police Judge Matthew Brady's court yesterday by Rev. F. A. Doane, pastor of the Mizpah Presbyterian Church.

Doane rose in court yesterday to say that Eske Hattain, one of his parishioners, had been herded into the corridor of the City Prison with 400 other men arrested for violation of the mask ordinance. There, said Doane, Hattain wanted to put up bail, but was told to keep quiet.

Then, said Doane, Hattain was taken to the saloon run by Danny Sullivan and Billy Lyons on Merchant street, opposite the Hall of Justice, and there was told that he could get out if he put up \$5. Hattain, said Doane, finally put up the money.

Judge Brady dismissed the case against Hattain and promised to see that he got his \$5 back. Chief of Police White has ordered an investigation and charges may be brought against the policemen concerned.
