

SIRENS WILL SIGNAL 'FLU' MASKS OFF

Every Whistle in City Firehouses
Will Sound Glad Tidings When
the Proclamation Is Signed

Epidemic Definitely Stamped Out;
Conditions Normal; Schools to
Open Monday; Quarantine Off

Every whistle at every fire station in San Francisco will sound the order to discard gauze masks tomorrow.

Mayor James Rolph will instruct the fire department to blow all whistles immediately he telephones on Thursday that the proclamation revoking the "mask-wearing" ordinance has been signed.

Mayor Rolph asks that factories and other concerns in San Francisco with steam whistles also blow the tidings when the fire department sounds the first note.

Dr. W. C. Hassler, city health officer, announced last night that the gauze masks will be discarded either shortly after noon tomorrow or shortly after 5 o'clock.

TRIES TO CALL MEETING.

He is endeavoring to call a special meeting of the Board of Health at 12 o'clock, but failing this members will meet in general session at 5 o'clock. Dr. Hassler will report to the meeting that the influenza epidemic is over and then ask the Mayor to issue his proclamation, which will make the masks a thing of the past.

Only three new cases were reported to the Board of Health yesterday.
